## Managing Teams

Coaching is extremely important; just as important is the manager of your teams. A small team or club may not require a manager but larger clubs can benefit greatly.

- There are very few competitions which do not require paperwork and other administrative duties. It is most effective to have a team manager to relieve the burden from the Coach or Captain.
- Most effective is the permanent team manager who can then create a roster and delegate tasks to team members, parents or supporters of the team.
- It is worthwhile acknowledging your Managers' contributions by such things as; reducing their fees, providing them with an official club shirt or team jacket.
- Clearly articulate the role of your team manager and delineate the duties between manager and coach.

### Handy Hints

A Manager should not contribute to coaching.

The Manager should not have to take on any officiating duties.

It is of considerable value for the manager to attend training to attend to any player or parent issues which do not pertain directly to playing the game.
