LOCAL GOVERNMENT ADVISORY BOARD REPORT: LOCAL GOVERNMENT STRUCTURAL AND ELECTORAL REFORM IN WESTERN AUSTRALIA - ENSURING THE FUTURE SUSTAINABILITY OF COMMUNITIES

The Local Government Advisory Board's recent report, Local Government Structural and Electoral Reform in Western Australia - Ensuring the Future Sustainability of Communities, has been made available for public comment. The Board's investigations led it to conclude that amalgamating local governments is one way of enhancing the delivery of services in certain areas and, among its many recommendations, it proposed that the Government should legislate for the amalgamation of a number of local governments.

The publication of the Report has led to concern by some local governments that the recommendations concerning legislated amalgamations will be accepted by the Government. I would like to make it clear that the Carpenter Government has no intention to force amalgamations.

The Government is supportive of amalgamations where the local governments concerned agree to do so. I encourage you to read the Report of the Local Government Advisory Board and examine your local government's operations in light of its recommendations. The Government is keen to advance structural reform initiatives and has committed to funding requests for feasibility studies and implementation through a \$3 million grants program over the next two years. The Department of Local Government and Regional Development will be providing information to you about this grant program shortly.

I wrote a letter to Tina Buckley in regards asking whether there could be any Council assistance for Rob making this trip, but as he has already received a \$100 grant to assist with travel to the Junior Australian Championships, his entitlements have been used up. That's no problem; we have a lot of fundraising happening to get us there (I'm going as Australian Team Coach). I have included the letter intended for Tina; it includes a bit more info on Rob.

While writing letters to so many people in regards to this trip, I thought I'd take this opportunity to thank you, and the Armadale City Council for all you do for our sport in this city. We are most thankful for our training facilities at the Armadale Arena along with the grants of \$100 made available each year to our athletes when they travel interstate representing WA.

This assistance has seen us develop a good club with young kids joining up on a regular basis. Armadale PCYC Weightlifting filled 4 out of 5 spots on the last State Team sent to Junior Nationals, and we made up the entire team for the Open Nationals immediately prior to that. We have some of the best Masters lifters in Australia lifting with us and promoting sport for mature aged people, in fact Grace Morrison (52 years young) is travelling to France in a few months for the World Masters Championships. I now have two qualified coaches assisting me and of course all coaching is done on a voluntary basis.

From my perspective the resources invested in our Club by The City of Armadale are paying off, in terms of, youth participation, aged participation (we have an 81 year old lifter), elite athlete development, and development of officials and volunteers. You would certainly find that anyone involved with weightlifting has good self-esteem and a great work ethic, two of the qualities that need developing in our community.

I know you are busy so please don't trouble yourself with a reply. If all goes to plan you'll see Rob in the local paper next month with a Commonwealth and/or Oceania Junior Medal round his neck. Thanks again for your support and assistance.

NEW SOCCER GOAL LEGISLATION

New moveable soccer goals must comply with WA legislation to be introduced this month. The legislation will require manufacturers to produce goals to higher safety standards. However, it is unlikely that existing moveable soccer goals comply with the safety requirements. Unanchored or inadequately anchored goals can tip over, causing serious injury or death. In 1999 a ten-year-old boy in NSW died when another young child pulled a moveable soccer goal down onto him. In 2003 a young girl in NSW also died under similar circumstances.

For the safety of children it is important that all moveable soccer goals are adequately secured or safely stored away at all times. In July, the Department of Consumer and Employment Protection will conduct a comprehensive education campaign alerting the public to the dangers of moveable soccer goals and suggesting steps that can be taken to safely secure them.

TENDER THRESHOLD

Research conducted by the Association has found that Local Governments spend approximately \$19 million complying with tender regulations. Therefore the Association applauds the Minister's statement at the Northern Country Zone meeting in Geraldton this May that the minimum tender threshold will be raised from \$50,000 to \$100,000.

The Association will also advocate that this threshold be indexed in accordance with the recently signed Intergovernmental Agreement. This agreement commits the State Government to avoid the cost-shifting that occurs through a lack of appropriate indexing.

The Association's research has found that at least \$3.5 million in regulatory burden is being unnecessarily placed on Local Government because the current tender threshold lacks indexing.

The Association will continue to advocate for the threshold to be increased and indexed.


Second R2R audit to include 1 in 8 councils

ALGA understands that the Australian National Audit Office intends to scrutinise the second phase of the *Roads to Recovery* program (R2R2) with 1 in 8 councils to be included in the audit. The first audit, completed earlier this year, saw the Audit Office examine the financial records and inspect projects of some 90 councils across the country to assess compliance with program requirements set by the Federal Department of Transport and Regional Services. ALGA is encouraging all councils to attend next month's National Local Roads and



Transport Congress, where one session will cover R2R2 project management. The Executive Director of AusLink, Leslie Riggs, will run the session. It will provide elected members and professional officers with advice to ensure the smooth management of projects. Ms Riggs will draw on the considerable body of experience the department has acquired in administering the program to encourage best practice among all councils in meeting their reporting requirements and funding conditions while keeping it free from unnecessary red tape. She will also draw on lessons learned from the first Audit Office review and provide a briefing about how local road funding fits in with AusLink principles. Commonwealth confirms councils under "financial pressure"



Local government in Australia is confronting "significant financial pressure" as service demands rise faster than revenue, according to the latest edition of the Local Government National Report published by the Australian Government this week. It says the unbalanced growth of revenues and expenditures experienced by councils - the 'structural gap' was not unique to Australia as similar financial stress had been observed in the USA, UK and Germany. The report said there had been considerable change in local government

directed at improving delivery of goods and services and conduct of regulatory functions. "Much has been achieved in making Australian local government more efficient and effective. Managerial practice has improved sharply, institutional changes have made councils much more client-focused than in the past, structural reforms have been absorbed and efficiency-enhancing outsourcing policies and practices have been implemented". It says the challenge for Australian local government is to "formulate strategies to reduce the 'structural gap' through sound financial management, increased efficiency gains and raising revenue, particularly own-source revenue where possible". The National Report is published by the Department of Transport and Regional Services.

Report provides snapshot of local government

Australia has 6,500 councillors, of whom 28% are women and more than 13% Indigenous, according to figures published this week in the latest edition of the Local Government National Report. The average number of councillors per council is 9.6 and the average population per councillor is just over 3,000. The report reveals that local government's share of taxation revenue continues to decline, with the federal government collecting 81.5% of total taxation revenue, states 15.7% and local government 2,98%. The report also shows



that the proportion of local government revenue derived from federal financial assistance grants continues to be significant. It has, however, declined from around 8% in 1998-99 to around 7% in 2003-04. The proportion of revenue from all federal funding sources, including the *Roads to Recovery* program and other specific purpose payments, was around 9% in 2003-04. The report shows that councils are making good use of *Regional Partnerships* with just over 30% of successful applicants coming form local government in 2004-05. Some 139 councils shared grants of \$54m.

Barry Ryan received an OAM for services to the Gloucester Shire and the Shires Association of NSW. I'm delighted to see so many people receiving honours either partly or wholly for their work in local government. It is a very visible demonstration of the hard work and sacrifice that so many Australians make when they choose to serve their communities through the institution of local government.

Bell praises Lake as legal career beckons

ALGA Vice President and President of the Municipal Association of Victoria, Cr Geoff Lake, will step down from these two posts on August 25 to pursue a legal career with a commercial law firm in Melbourne. ALGA President, Cr Paul Bell, praised Cr Lake's contribution to local government at the state and national level, saying he had been a passionate and talented advocate for the sector. Cr Lake has had a meteoric career in local government. He was first elected to the Monash City Council in Melbourne in 2000 when aged just 20. At 22, he became the state's youngest mayor. At 24, he was elected as the MAV President, defeating seven other candidates. He was elected as one of the two ALGA Vice Presidents in December that year. Cr Lake will retain his role as a councillor at Monash.

Councils trim staff

Commonwealth and state bureaucracies continue to grow while local government's workforce contracts, according to <u>new figures</u> released by the Australian Bureau of Statistics yesterday. It said the total number of federal public servants increased 0.7% in the March quarter, to reach 255,700. Over the full year, Commonwealth public servant numbers were up almost 3%. State bureaucracies grew 0.6% in the March quarter to 1.2m. Over the full year, state public servant numbers were up 3.1%. But local government employees fell 0.9% to 164,100. Over the past 12 months, local government employees were down 0.1%. This reverses a period of growth that has seen numbers recover from a low of 140,000 in 2000 to reach 165,000 last year.

The parliamentary secretary with responsibility for water, Malcolm Turnbull, has suggested urban water restrictions employed by state and local government are more about protecting cashflow than conserving a scarce resource. In a speech last week, <u>Mr Turnbull said</u> water restrictions "may" be designed to conserve water in the short term, but in the long-term "the principal contribution is to preserve the profitability and cashflow, strong cashflows of water utilities, and enable the postponement of investment ...". "We have to ask ourselves whether we should be demanding of our politicians, principally state politicians and in some places, local government politicians, that they supply our cities with the water they need, just as readily as they provide our cities with the electricity they need."

Comment sought on Cairns corridor

A <u>draft study of transport options</u> and issues for the Brisbane to Cairns corridor was released for public comment this week by the Australian and Queensland governments. The study will help with investment decisions for the Bruce Highway and North Coast Railway beyond 2009. The study is the first of 24 corridor strategies being developed for the AusLink National Transport Network, the national transport plan for the principal road and rail system linking capital cities and major population centres. The strategies are due to be completed by mid-2007. Comment is invited by July 7.

Recreational fishing grants

Round 3 of the <u>Recreational Fishing Community Grants Program</u> will support local initiatives that enhance recreational fishing and tourism through on-ground activities, education and awareness as well as protecting coastal environments. Funding of up to \$100,000 is available and applicants are required to contribute at least half the total cost of the project in cash and/or in-kind support. To be eligible, groups must be legal entities or sponsored by legal entities such as local government or incorporated community groups. Local government is also eligible. Round 3 of the program closes on July 28. Further details available online or by calling 02 6272 3848.

Indigenous, housing councils meet

ALGA will participate at today's meeting of the Ministerial Council for Aboriginal Affairs and Torres Strait Islander Affairs (MCATSIA) and the Housing Ministers' Conference. The ministerial councils are both meeting in Parramatta and will take the opportunity of conducting a joint sitting. ALGA's representative at MCATSIA is Cr Bill Mitchell (WA) and Cr Ann Bennison (QLD) at the Housing Conference. The joint meeting will discuss the implementation of an Indigenous housing investment and reform strategy. While there is general agreement on the need for revised action and investment strategies, discussion is likely to focus on the most appropriate investment options available and the actual quantum and allocation mechanisms associated with any agreed investment arrangement.

Town planning write large

Paris Mayor Bertrand Delanoë is presenting controversial plans to reshape the French capital, unveiling a blueprint which could result in what has been described as "an architectural, economic and social revolution". The move is a response to demographic and social concerns. Paris has lost one tenth of its jobs in the past 15 years and its population of 2m is shrinking by more than 1% a year. The Socialist mayor faces stiff opposition. The Communist Party believes that Paris should build upwards, allowing large clusters of skyscrapers on its periphery while the Greens want the city to spread outwards, breaking down the barriers between Paris and its sometimes troubled suburbs.

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Eminent economist backs constitutional recognition

An eminent economist, Professor Wolfgang Kasper, has this week thrown his weight behind constitutional recognition of local government. The comments have been welcomed by ALGA President, Cr Paul Bell, as an important boost to the campaign for formal recognition of local government. In an ABC Radio 'Counterpoint' address, Professor Kasper said that councils were typically seen as "not-very-sexy extensions of state government". "All this ought to be changed," he argued. "We need a referendum to give local government an autonomous place in our democracy". The British Government had recently launched action to devolve tasks and taxes to councils so that local citizens had more say and could enjoy diversity of conditions and life opportunities. "A similar devolution would seem timely here, too. It would help turn this great, prospering country into a great and happier nation."



He said local government had much greater demands and expectations placed on it today than in the past and yet councils had to survive on a narrow, slow growing revenue base. "Little wonder that we have to cope with more potholes, longer delays in building approvals and the erosion of local autonomy by interfering, ill-informed state authorities. Citizens are short-changed wherever councils are controlled and over-regulated, operate in a murky bureaucratic jungle and can be sacked by the state on a pretext." Wolfgang Kasper is an Emeritus Professor at the University of NSW and a Senior Fellow at the Centre for Independent Studies.

FAGs: Councils now \$170m out of pocket



Local government is now \$170m out of pocket as a result of a one-off decision a decade ago to limit the escalation factor for local government financial assistance grants. In 1997-98, the Federal Treasurer made the decision to increase FAGs for inflation but not for population growth. The reduction in FAGs was equivalent to a cut of about 1.2% in total funding, or \$14m. This was a reduction in the FAGs base that has never been made good. As a consequence, each year's FAGs have been lower than would otherwise have been the case. ALGA calculates that the total cumulative loss of FAGs since 1997-98, taking into account the escalation in the FAGs over the past 10 years, is now in the order of \$170m. ALGA President, Cr Paul Bell, said this was just one more reason why the system needed to be overhauled. "It's a 30 year old

system that denies councils access to fair funding. The sooner it's reformed, the better."

ALGA on track: Bell hails three major milestones

At the national level, local government has reached three major milestones during the first six months of the year, Cr Bell told the Local Government Association of Tasmania's annual conference in Hobart this week. In a speech amounting to a mid-year review, Cr Bell said the milestones included:

- an historic intergovernmental agreement to counter cost shifting
- an additional \$300m for local roads in the Federal Budget
- commissioning a PricewaterhouseCoopers study on local government financing

Cr Bell said these were "important developments that advance our campaign for fair federal funding, fair treatment and formal recognition". The additional funding for local roads was a "visible demonstration of the Australian Government's faith in local government," Cr Bell said. The second half of the year would see the completion of the Commonwealth Grants Commission review of the interstate distribution of roads grants, the passage of a parliamentary motion recognising local government and a Productivity Commission review of barriers to council revenue. "Most importantly, the PwC study will be completed and will form the basis of comprehensive submissions to the major parties for fair federal funding, well in advance of the 2007 federal election. We will put the strongest possible case to the major parties - and we will expect equally strong policy responses from them in the lead up to the federal poll," Cr Bell said.

From the President

This week I want to issue a big plea to all councillors and mayors. Please, please, please avoid confusing - or even scaring - state and federal governments with calls to share the GST with councils. A state treasurer this week issued a statement saying he would not support a call to provide GST revenue to local government because it would interfere with the state's ability to provide essential services.



We need the state and federal governments to support our call for local government to gain access to a source of growth funds. We are currently calling for a share of at least one per cent of Commonwealth taxation revenue - excluding GST. We have spent some time trying to reassure the states that we do not want to get our hands on what they very firmly see as "their" money. The support of state and federal governments is critical if we are to secure a fair funding deal for local government. They are unlikely to support us if they think we want to access GST funding. This funding comprises an increasingly important part of state government revenue. In your discussions with federal MPs and senators, please press the case for a fair share of Commonwealth taxation revenue. The arguments for fair federal funding are summarised on the ALGA website in our Budget submission, speeches and media releases. ALGA will! later th is year mount a comprehensive lobbying campaign to secure commitments to fair funding in advance of the next federal election. Our campaign will be developed once we have the results of the PricewaterhouseCoopers study on local government financing, commissioned by ALGA in April. ALGA will be forwarding campaign kits to all councils once the study has been completed and analysed. Your support or the campaign will be critical to securing a successful outcome. In the meantime, let's all sing from the same hymn book!

Big week for local roads

Next week will be a significant one for local roads. Australia's 700 councils will receive the additional \$300m Roads to Recovery payment – announced in the May Federal Budget – by next Friday, June 30. Next Friday is also the reporting date for the Commonwealth Grants

Commission's review of the interstate distribution of financial assistance grants for local roads component. The review was commissioned by Federal Local Government Minister Jim Lloyd as part of his response to the Fair Share report on cost shifting and local government financing. Jim Lloyd used Question Time in Federal Parliament this week to outline the magnitude of the additional Roads to Recovery payment. He said the 18 councils in Southeast Queensland would receive a total of \$22.2m by next Friday while the 32 councils in the Federal electorate of Kalgoorlie would share \$12.9m. Long term funding solutions for local roads will be discussed at next month's Local Roads and Transport Congress, to be held in Alice Springs on July 9-11.

End in sight for brake noise?

Excessive engine brake noise in sensitive residential areas could soon be curbed. The National Transport Commission (NTC) is conducting research to develop a means of picking-out engine brake noise from the traffic stream. Trials of a roadside engine "noise camera" are also underway. Engine brake noise caused by worn, defective or inferior mufflers on heavy vehicles has been a community concern for some time, yet remains largely unregulated. Australia is now leading the world in developing a standard to address the issue. The potential now exists for governments to specify engine brake noise exclusion zones in noise-sensitive high density population areas, where there is no risk to vehicle safety. A <u>draft regulatory impact statement</u> outlining the proposed regulatory options has been released on the NTC website for public consultation. Comment is sought by August 4. NTC will consider the responses and, providing a net benefit can be demonstrated, will prepare a recommendation to the Australian Transport Council.

Wind farms, packaging on EPHC agenda

Australia's environment ministers and ALGA are meeting today to discuss a range of environment protection issues, including a <u>national code for wind farms</u>, plastic bag use, national guidelines for water recycling and the national packaging covenant. Ministers are considering at what point smaller companies should be subject to the provisions of the packaging covenant. A significant number of large corporations have not re-signed the covenant since it was renewed in July last year. Local government will be represented at today's meeting of the Environment Protection and Heritage Council by ALGA Vice President, Cr Bill Mitchell.

Indigenous housing under-spend

Australia's housing ministers have agreed to the development of standards for the delivery of Indigenous housing, including a review of corporate governance, financial performance and accountability. This was a key outcome of last Friday's housing minister's meeting in Sydney. Federal Indigenous Affairs Minister, Mal Brough, used the occasion to pressure the states into spending more on Indigenous housing, saying the Commonwealth provided 73% of funding while the states picked up just 27%. "I am concerned by the extensive under-spend by the states and territories on Indigenous housing over recent years," he said. ALGA was represented at the meeting by ALGA Board Member, Cr Ann Bennison. The Ministerial Council on Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Affairs also met in Sydney last Friday, with ALGA represented by Vice President, Cr Bill Mitchell.

Safer communities awards

<u>Emergency Management Australia</u> is seeking applications for the 2006 Australian Safer Communities Awards. These awards recognise best practice and innovation by organisations

and individuals that help build safer communities across Australia. All aspects of community safety are covered by the awards including risk assessment, research, education and training, information and knowledge management, prevention, preparedness, response and recovery. Entries close on August 4.

Overseas aid white paper

The Australian Government recently launched a white paper on its <u>overseas aid program</u>. This strategic framework for the future direction of Australian aid will guide the doubling of the Australian Government's overseas aid budget by 2010. The Government is now discussing the implementation and opportunities of the white paper with a broad range of stakeholders. A series of <u>special public forums</u> will be held in capital cities, starting on Monday. Call Juliana Robinson on 02 8572 5600 for further details.

Podcasting mayor reaches out to youth

The Mayor of Boston is trying a new approach to reach the city's disaffected youth - by making his speeches available to download onto their iPods. Mayor Thomas Menino has already released his first 'track', which is available on the city council's website. It begins with an anti-violence rap tune from local band Four Peace, before the Mayor launches into a speech about the city's new gun buyback program."It's a way to reach young people," Mayor Menino told the 'Boston Globe'. "You have to find where your audience is and communicate with them. A lot of people in our community are using iPods." Future downloads will encourage the kids to get information on city housing programs and summer jobs. City officials hope to have the audio files translated into other languages, including Spanish, Chinese, and Vietnamese - perhaps in anticipation of a world tour. LGIB

Ambulance Issue Highlights Regional Health Problems

Health services in regional Western Australia need urgent attention to avoid lives being put at risk.

Responding to reports of compromised ambulance services, WA Local Government Association President Cr Bill Mitchell said there were resource problems across the scope of regional health services.

Cr Mitchell said of primary concern was the difficulty regional areas had in attracting medical doctors to rural and remote communities.

"It is not just a case of there being not enough ambulances but also not enough doctors," Cr Mitchell said.

"Often Local Governments make the decision to provide housing and other incentives to attract a doctor to their communities.

"At a time when the State is experiencing an economic boom, it is not acceptable that in some of the very places where that wealth is being generated, they have compromised medical services."

Cr Mitchell said WALGA supports the Country Medical Foundation which provides scholarships to medical students who commit to working in regional areas.

"There has to be an approach that looks across all components of regional health services to redress some of the serious problems that are going unnoticed by the decision makers in the metropolitan area," Cr Mitchell said.

"It is acknowledged that provision of doctors is the primary responsibility of the Commonwealth Government and hospitals of the State. However, these two spheres, together with Local Government, need to work together more closely to provide basic health care to rural and regional Australia.

"The gap in providing infrastructure and funding support for critical services such doctors, police and teachers in regional areas is being met by Local Government which is not sustainable in the longer term."

Better Cost Planning for Local Government

Councils will be able to better measure the cost of delivering services to the community with the release of an alternative measure for cost budgeting.

The Western Australian Local Government Association has released a Local Government Cost Index (LGCI) as an alternative to the sole use of the Consumer Cost Index (CPI), commonly used in planning and budgeting processes.

Association President, Cr Bill Mitchell said the new process would allow Councils to better gauge their costs and financial viability and assist in the setting of rates.

"This new cost index will allow Councils to balance more accurately the service expectations of the community with the capacity of the Local Government to fund these services," Cr Mitchell said.

"With the current focus on the sustainability of Local Government, better forecasting and measurement processes will assist Councils to decide on the best ways in which they can service their community."

Using a combination of the CPI and the General Construction Index WA (70% and 30% respectively), the Local Government Cost Index will offer an indication of those changes in the WA economy that relate more closely to the functions of Local Government.

The CPI is a measure of the increase in price of a bundle of goods consumed by an average household and as such is an inaccurate guide to actual Local Government cost increases, as Local Government has very different consumption patterns to the average Australian household. A South Australian inquiry into Local Government financial sustainability has found that reliance on the CPI alone may undermine the long term financial sustainability of Local Governments.

As the 'bundle of goods' relating to Local Government has a high proportion of general construction activity in the form of works such as roads, bridges and sewerage systems, taking into account the General Construction Index of WA will give a better indication of the changes in prices for delivering Local Government services.

South West's Biodiversity Protection Given Local Kick-start

A project to conserve biodiversity in the South West in the face of increasing pressures on the environment from regional growth will be launched at a function in Bunbury today.

The WA Local Government Association's South West Biodiversity Project (SWBP) involves six South West Local Governments receiving a financial kick-start in helping them to conserve biodiversity in their local government area.





INFORMATION ITEM - DESIGNING OUT CRIME PLANNING GUIDELINES

The Western Australian Planning Commission has recently released *Planning Bulletin No.79* to introduce the *Designing Out Crime Planning Guidelines*. The guidelines are intended to raise awareness of key community safety, security and crime prevention issues, designing out crime principles and solutions and to ensure that planning takes these into consideration.

The guidelines establish a ten-step process for developing designing out crime initiatives.

The guidelines establish the important criteria that will guide the WAPC in its consideration of subdivision applications and they will be able to be used in guiding local government in determining development applications. It may be appropriate for local government to make designing out crime policies under the town planning scheme. The guidelines could be adopted as a whole or in part as a planning policy.

All planning and development applications should be able to demonstrate how crime prevention measures have been considered.

The 60 page Guidelines establish a ten step process for developing designing out crime initiatives.

These steps are illustrated on Figure 1.

Designing out crime principles could be based on the following design and usage concepts:

- Surveillance:
- Access control;
- Territorial reinforcement (features designed to express ownership and control of the environment);
- Target hardening (security measures such as security grills); and
- Management and maintenance (to ensure continued use of the space for the purpose intended).

The Guidelines include a Designing Out Crime Toolbox. The Toolbox includes:

- Natural surveillance (windows overlooking streets, avoid dense bushes and blind corners, low fencing, video cameras);
- Urban structure (avoid long rear laneways or culs-de-sac, orient buildings to the front street);
- Land use mix (encourage uses that promote activity and encourage pedestrian passage through uses);
- Activity generators (promote complimentary activities that create mutual surveillance);
- Building design (create observed entrances, care in designing lobbies, windows to overlook public areas, illuminate entries);
- Lighting (maximise lighting and signage);


- Landscape (use low shrubs and avoid plants screening doorways);
- Management and maintenance (considerations include reporting of crime, repair of damage);
- Sightlines and way finding (avoid blind corners or changes in gradient which impedes views);
- Signage (to be easily legible at all hours);
- Predictable routes and spaces safe from entrapment (use of security patrols, additional lighting or fencing off certain areas);
- Civic and town centres (careful design of car parks and public transport facilities);
- Parks and public open space (visible from the street, overlook from development, promote community use and ownership);
- Car parks, including grade and multi-storey (prefer small car parks, active land uses nearby, clear access points);
- Transit stations (avoid isolated locations, ensure direct access, maximise surveillance);
- Public toilets (locate adjacent to high traffic with visible approaches and adequate lighting);
- Pedestrian routes, laneways, alleyways and accessways (avoid dead ends or where foot traffic will be low);
- Pedestrian overpasses and underpasses (ensure direct sightlines, avoid recesses);

CONCLUSION

The Designing Out Crime Planning Guidelines provide a useful approach for planners and could be used increasingly in the assessment of development applications. It may be appropriate in the future to consider adopting the Guidelines, or parts of them, formally as policy under the town planning scheme.

GENERAL BUSINESS

1 Municipal Heritage Inventory - Update

Mr Carder gave a brief update on the progress of the draft MHI being undertaken by Palassis Architects. Committee Members can still provide additional information either verbally or written where appropriate.

INFORMATION ITEM - COMMUNITY HERITAGE ADVISORY COMMITTEE MEETING

2 Suggested wording for latest 10 heritage plaques (for properties approved by Council at its meeting in December 2005).

Committee Members discussed the form of wording for the 10 heritage plaques and recommended the following wording on nine (9) of them for consideration by the CEO and Mayor.

Old Railway Hotel

Built in 1902, this is one of the oldest buildings left in Jull Street. It was an important social centre enjoying popularity as a hotel and a honeymoon destination. The verandahs were removed in the 1960s.

Old Roads Board Building

Built in 1903, it reflects the growth of Armadale and signifies the change of emphasis of municipal administration from Kelmscott to Armadale. The Roads Board was responsible for most transport and civic infrastructure in the municipality.

Wirra Willa Gardens

The original garden was designed in 1935 by Sister Barbara Whitehead and Evelyn Broadley and features a wide range of exotic trees. The garden is recognised Australia wide. Ms Whitehead once conducted the Armadale Public Library from the property.

Paradise Cottage

Built around 1860, Paradise Cottage is believed to be the oldest building in the area. The property is connected with the Marsh and Batt families and was an early productive farm.

Congregational Church, Kelmscott

The first Congregational Church in Kelmscott. It was built in 1905 by John A Buckingham with locally produced bricks.

Old Station Master's Residence

The house, built circa 1900, was the home of various Station Masters from the turn of the century. It was designed by the Public Works Department.

Poplar Homestead and Mill site

Built by Thomas Buckingham Jr in 1868. His wife Hannah was a much loved local midwife. The Buckinghams were pioneers in the timber industry. The saw mill built circa 1886, with a (now demolished) water wheel, was sited on the river.

INFORMATION ITEM – COMMUNITY HERITAGE ADVISORY COMMITTEE MEETING

Araluen Park

Araluen Park was founded by JJ Simons for the Young Australia League in 1929. With the Grove of the Unforgotten, extensive gardens and buildings, Araluen is a significant part of the local heritage and recognised nationally.

Roleystone Theatre

Built by F Fancote in 1922 as a community hall under the auspices of the Roleystone Progress Association, the building has played an important role in the cultural and social life of Roleystone and was converted to a theatre in 1975-6.

It was agreed that further research was required on Haydock's Existing Homesite (from whom or where did the name come). Mr Fletcher agreed to undertake the research.

3. Suggestions for a new name for Jull Street Mall and portion of Streich Avenue.

The matter of renaming of Jull Street Mall was discussed. It was agreed that, despite the Geographic Names Committee's aversion to "double banger" names and the proximity to Jull Street, Martin Jull Place should be suggested. Martin Jull was prominent in both Armadale and the State, had a place of importance in the early wine growing industry and needed more recognition, particularly in Armadale.

After discussion, it was agreed that firstly Streich Avenue or secondly Commerce Avenue be recommended for the continuation of the unmade portion of Streich Avenue.

4. Proposal to Rename the Suburb of Westfield to Champion Lakes.

After discussion it was generally felt that it should be recommended that Westfield become part of Kelmscott. Many people in the area still identify themselves with Kelmscott.

Preservation of the Wandoo Tree on verge of reserve 29937 Wandoo Street, Mt Nasura

(Mr Holton declared an interest in this item, as he lives in close proximity to the reserve, and took no part in the decision)

Council, at its meeting on 19 December 2005, resolved among other things to rezone Reserve 29937 on Wandoo St Mt Nasura to Residential R10/25, cancel the reserve, dispose of the land for residential development, and refer the matter of the long-term preservation of the wandoo tree that occupies the verge to the City's Heritage Advisory Committee for consideration.

The Committee considered the matter and a photograph of the tree. It agreed to the following recommendation.

INFORMATION ITEM - COMMUNITY HERITAGE ADVISORY COMMITTEE MEETING

Recommend

That CHAC recommend to the City of Armadale that Council place a Tree Preservation Order under paragraph 11.8.1 of the City of Armadale's Town Planning Scheme No 4 on the Wandoo tree on the verge of Reserve 29937 to ensure its long-term protection, subject to a report by a qualified arboreaculturist on the trees health and expected longevity.

URGENT MATTERS

1. Rose Bush on Martin Street road reserve

A question had been asked at the Development Services Committee meeting on 14 February 2006 in regard to the Consultant's report on the Canning River Precinct Community Consultation and Planning Study to the effect is Council aware that vegetation in the Martin Street road reserve and a rose bush in the vicinity of the original Martin house (that has since been identified by the Heritage Rose Society) may be of potential significance to the history, heritage and environmental aspects of the amendment area?

The matter was discussed and it was agreed that the Martin Street road reserve should be considered for setting up as a special country lane landscape heritage feature. It was also agreed that the matter of the heritage roses, the 3 log crossing at Cronin's Ford and the portion of Martin Street road reserve running down to the river should be referred to Palassis Architects for assessment for incorporation in the MHI.

2. Armadale Redevelopment Authority's Cultural Heritage Strategy

It was suggested that the ARA's Cultural Heritage Strategy needs a wider publication to enable reasoned comment. Any sensitive copyright plans could be omitted, but a wider distribution, including the website, would enable more community comment.

3. Old Jarrah Tree at the Armadale City Shopping Centre

It was noted that the Jarrah Tree is being surrounded by more development and concern was expressed about its future of this extremely significant tree. It was suggested that some way of regeneration, such as the preservation and nurture of any seedlings springing up from the tree, should be found for if the tree dies.

4. Bodhi Tree on Albany Highway, Kelmscott

It was noted that the Bodhi tree on the west side of Albany Highway, Kelmscott, near the Telstra building needs documenting and preserving. It was a Bodhi tree under which Buddha sat whilst seeking enlightenment.

5. Resignation of Mrs Bloomfield

Mrs Bloomfield presented her written resignation to the Committee. She is moving to Augusta so cannot continue in the position. She thanked those present for their support and assistance during her time on CHAC.

The Chairperson, on behalf of the Committee, thanked Mrs Bloomfield for her service on the Committee and wished her well for the future.

1. Kelmscott Infant Health Centre.

Copies of the measured drawings were forwarded to Committee Members with the Agenda. It was noted that the building has been taken down and the materials have been marked and stored at the City's Depot.

11. COUNTRY OF ORIGIN LABELLING

In view of the recent changes to the National Food Standards with respect to country of origin labelling of fresh fruit and vegetables and the coverage in *The West Australian* suggesting that, to at least a degree, this is an issue of public health importance, Councillors may be interested to know that a recent survey coordinated by the WA Department of Health and in which the City participated has found that almost 99 per cent of fresh produce on supermarket shelves is free from harmful bacteria.

42 local governments took part in the survey, which was prompted by concerns over imported fruit and vegetables, and 491 samples of local and imported product were submitted to laboratory examination targeting bacteria known to cause food poisoning, including E.coli, Campylobacter, Salmonella and Listeria. The overwhelming majority of samples posed no risk to public health.

1.3 per cent of results showed marginal or unsatisfactory levels of bacterial contamination, but only one sample, **WA grown** spinach, showed levels that were potentially hazardous.

The survey concluded that there was no significant difference between local and imported products with respect to bacterial contamination.

Notwithstanding that, fruit and vegetables can obviously become contaminated during growth, harvesting, processing, distribution, retail sale and final preparation, so such products should be thoroughly washed before consumption.


