OVERSEAS SKILLS EXPOS PROPOSAL

On behalf of Local Governments in WA, the Association will be presenting a booth at three overseas skills expos organised by Department of Immigration and Multicultural Affairs (DIMA) to promote Local Government in Western Australia and to shortlist applicants on their behalf for vacant positions. The locations and dates for these expos are:

London

14-15 October

Manchester

17-18 October

Dublin

21-22 October

Local Governments are offered the opportunity to provide the details of any vacant skilled positions they would like WALGA to recruit.

WALGA will interview and shortlist applicants qualified and experienced for these positions from overseas while liaising with DMIA on immigration requirements. Short listed applicants will then be interviewed by the Local Government and WALGA through video conference prior to being employed.

It is anticipated that employees would be employed under a Temporary Business (Long Stay) Visa 457 which provides for a term of up to four years. The employee is able to apply for permanent residency at the conclusion of this period.

To assist in covering the cost of the initiative, Local Governments will be requested to contribute \$3,000 per position as a service fee.

Local Governments interested in this initiative will be asked to provide a position description, contractual details and information on their community or region to maximise their desirability to potential applicants.

WALGA also expect to attend the expo at the Perth Convention Centre on **Saturday, 11 November**, and dependant upon the success of the initiative, will continue the strategy next year.

DIESEL FUEL SUPPLIES

The Association's Diesel Fuel rebate consultancy program has to date recovered \$930,000 in revenue from outstanding diesel fuel tax credits for 76 members who have completed audits.

The Association's commercial services program is now exploring additional product areas to support diesel procurement, including a financial hedging product called a Diesel Index Swap.

This facility provides protection against future price movements and greater confidence in budgeting, and could potentially save significant expenditure on Diesel within the sector, of which Local Government in Western Australia collectively purchases several hundred thousand litres per annum.

Details of this product will be presented by the Commonwealth Bank in a boardroom presentation on **Wednesday, 13 September** at 2.00pm.

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Councils not to blame for drop in housing affordability

A report released on 14 August by the Local Government Association of Queensland (LGAQ) puts to rest the assertions of the building industry that councils are responsible for driving up house prices. Critically, the research prepared for the LGAQ shows that across Queensland as a whole, the rate of production of housing lots by developers has been 30% below the rate of council approvals. The Report builds on an earlier



inquiry by the Productivity Commission in 2004 which found that much of the increase in housing prices in recent years is the result of cheaper and more readily available finance and not land release, approvals processes or taxes and charges.

"Claims by the building industry that council fees and charges are causing house prices to rise are wrong", said Cr Paul Bell, President of ALGA. "The report prepared for LGAQ also shows that the development approvals processes of councils are not to blame for the delays in the release of land." The Report also shows that leading developers continue to make strong profits with leading companies making 20% returns on investments.

The findings in the Report and the Productivity Commission's findings are also at odds with the comments of Treasurer Peter Costello earlier this week that State Government land release policies and taxes are responsible for increased housing costs and reduced affordability. The Treasurer's comments came hot on the heels of an increase in interest rates and coincided with the release of a hounding affordability report which says housing affordability dropped 5 per cent in the June quarter.

From the President

Housing affordability has become a major issue for individual purchasers, particularly the young, and for governments and it's a concern shared by local government. ALGA, through its role on the Local Government Planning Ministers Council, has participated in a joint effort with Housing Ministers to develop an action plan to address housing affordability.



Our efforts to tackle the issue in a constructive and cooperative way, however, have been in contrast to the disingenuous claims by the development industry that councils' land release policies, development processes and fees and charges are responsible for declining affordability.

The leading research in this area was undertaken by the Productivity Commission in 2004. The Commission's report found that factors such as greater access to finance and a surge of demand for established inner city housing have driven prices up, not fees and charges. The Commission's findings have been supported by local government's own research which finds that developers are not releasing the blocks made available to them by councils. Our research also shows that while purchasers might be struggling with housing costs,

developers continue to make handsome returns. It is too easy to try to jump on a bandwagon of blaming local government for the problem and I am disappointed that Peter Costello also tried to push this line earlier this week by stating that restrictive land supply policies and taxes are responsible for the housing affordability problem.

NGA06: Pushing the Agenda

Registrations are now open for this year's <u>National General Assembly</u> - *Pushing the Agenda*. The General Assembly will focus on progress of the Triple F campaign - launched at NGA 2005 - Fair federal funding, Fair treatment, Formal recognition. It will build on three significant milestones for local government achieved so far this year - securing an intergovernmental agreement, or IGA, on cost shifting; the \$300m boost to the *Roads to Recovery program* in the Federal Budget, coming on top of an additional \$100 million for the AusLink strategic regional program announced by the Australian Government at NGA 2005; and the PricewaterhouseCoopers major study on local government financing commissioned by ALGA. Work has also progressed on a resolution to recognise local government, expected to be presented to Parliament this sitting. In addition, the ALGA President, Cr Paul Bell, will launch the National Local Roads and Transport Strategy - the subject of this year's National Local Roads and Transport Congress held in Alice Springs. This year's NGA will *Push the Agenda* as local government prepares for the next federal election in 2007 - an Assembly not to be missed!

Beazley, Carr head politicians to speak at NGA06

The Leader of the Opposition, Kim Beazley, will close this year's National General Assembly, while Senator Kim Carr, Shadow Minister for Housing, Urban Development, Local Government and Territories will also address Assembly delegates. ALGA President, Cr Paul Bell, said, "We are delighted to have the support of leading federal parliamentarians - it demonstrates the spirit of cooperation that exists between the local and federal spheres". This year's keynote presentation will be given by Grahame Morris, the head of PricewaterhouseCoopers Office of Federal Government Services and heading ALGA's local government financing study. He will be joined by Barry Easther, Mayor of West Tamar Council - put under the media spotlight after the rock fall disaster at the Beaconsfield gold mine on Anzac Day - Robyn Moore, multi-skilled communicator, and the Founder and Chairman of Clean Up Australia, Ian Kiernan. Program and registration details are now available on the recently refurbished National General Assembly website.

In order to address delegates' strong concerns regarding motions for debate, a General Assembly Review Committee has been set up by the ALGA Board. Two significant changes for this year's Assembly are the return of full plenary debate and strict assessment of all motions submitted against the criteria of national significance. Issues not included for debate in the Business Papers are welcomed in Open House - a networking space specifically designed for delegates to discuss issues not on the main agenda - why not make a booking in advance of the National General Assembly? This is your opportunity to discuss what's happening on your home patch.

Stocktake of emergency management

Reducing regulatory burdens

This week the Federal Treasurer announced the Australian Government's final response to the Banks Taskforce report *Rethinking regulation: Report of the taskforce on reducing regulatory burdens on business.* The government's response addresses all 178 recommendations. In summary the Government has agreed in full or in part to 158 of the recommendations. Action in specific areas includes:

- tougher rules for making new regulation, including cost benefit analysis
- o screening of all regulation at least every five years
- work to harmonise state and territory conveyancing laws
- o work towards a single regulator for mine safety
- o an FBT reporting exclusion for pooled motor vehicles
- o improved education and advice for occupational health and safety
- o a review of the thresholds for the definition of a large proprietary company
- o a simplified accounting method to be developed for small restaurants, cafes and
- commencement of work on the national streamlining of business names through the ABN/ABR system
- alignment between definitions of small business, employer and associate
- aligning training and licensing and mutual recognition of occupational licensing.

Proposed BCA 2007 Amendments

The draft amendments for the 2007 edition of the Building Code of Australia (BCA) are now available for review and public comment.

The proposed changes to Volume One and Volume Two of the BCA follow research and consultation with industry and other stakeholders. They include, among other things, updated cross-referencing to Standards and other documents, updated energy efficiency provisions, and technical and editorial changes. If adopted, the changes would take effect from 1 May 2007.

The draft BCA changes are available from the Australian Building Code Board.

Comments are invited until Friday 25 August 2006, and are to be sent to BCA2007@abcb.gov.au using the response sheet template available from the ABCB website.

Building access FAQ

There are two types of law that cover access to buildings and facilities within them, the *Building Code of Australia* (BCA) and anti-discrimination law such as the *Disability Discrimination Act* 1992 (DDA). In most states and territories there is a similar anti-discrimination law covering access to buildings. Compliance with the BCA does not necessarily mean the building complies with the requirements of the DDA or state and territory anti-discrimination laws.

Information Bulletin Correspondence & Papers

A <u>Frequently Asked Questions</u> has been placed on the Australian Human Rights and Equal Opportunity Commission's website. The FAQ covers the question of whether or not the Commission can grant exemptions from the DDA or the BCA in relation to access requirements to buildings. This will be of particular interest to local government and building certifiers who are trying to address access issues and the current inconsistencies between the BCA and DDA.

It hopes to combine the delights of sun, sea and sand with a respect for sharia law. 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Parliamentary recognition of local government

The campaign for constitutional recognition of local government has moved a step closer with the resolution to be debated shortly in Federal Parliament. ALGA has written to MPs and senators seeking their support for the motion recognising local government and acknowleging the role it plays within our federal system of governance. ALGA was pleased at the bipartisan approach taken by the House of Representatives inquiry into 'Local government and cost shifting.' Parliamentary recognition of local government



was one of a series of important recommendations contained in the *Fair Share* report produced by the inquiry chaired by David Hawker MP and Anna Burke MP as the Deputy Chair. Copies of the <u>information can be downloaded</u> (PDF 23 kb) by councils to support their own advocacy with federal representatives.

Housing affordability may be on COAG agenda



Housing affordability is expected to be included on the agenda at the Council of Australian Governments meeting in Canberra later this year. Prime Minister John Howard has blamed state governments for making home ownership a 'diminishing dream' for young Australians. Mr Howard told the Labor state governments to stop bowing to pressure from environmental groups and make land available for new housing. He said the cost of land in Sydney had risen

700 per cent between 1973 and 2003 and was the main reason first-home buyers found prices unaffordable, not the recent jump in interest rates. He said while the cost of land had risen sevenfold between 1973 and 2003, the increase in the housing component of a house-land package in that period was only four per cent.

Opposition treasury spokesman Wayne Swan accused Mr Howard of trying to shift the blame. "John Howard can't blame the states for the three interest rate increases since the election, the election where he promised to keep interest rates at record lows," Mr Swan said. "So let's forget the blame shifting. What we want to see from this prime minister is some responsibility - some responsibility by putting forward a plan to put downward pressure on interest rates and downward pressure on inflation."

The latest ABS House Price Index figures show that in the June quarter prices have jumped 3.1% nationally, with WA showing the largest increase of 11.9% and Sydney showing a 1.4% increase (-0.5% lower than last year). However, Housing Industry Association figures released on Wednesday show that despite the rhetoric, housing affordability is better than three years ago in the capital cities due to increases in disposable income. But, outside the capitals, housing affordability is a different story, with affordability the worst since September 1989.

Labor's policy on water recycling

Federal Labor announced its water recycling policy this week which sets a national target of 30% of wastewater being recycled by 2015. The policy involves developing consistent, comprehensive national guidelines for water recycling; providing the leadership, support and investment necessary to achieve the 30% recycling target; and encouraging innovation and new technological solutions to deliver a sustainable water supply for Australia.



From the President

It was heartening to hear the news this week that progress has been made on talks between the Norfolk Island Government and the Australian Government on reform of governance of the Island. I have not been fortunate enough to visit the Island myself but have heard from others that it is a fabulous place, steeped in tradition and with an enviable sense of community and local engagement which enriches the life of its inhabitants and contributes greatly to its attraction as a tourist destination.



Unlike Christmas and Cocos Islands, which are governed under a local government model, Norfolk Island is currently a self-governing external territory. Local Government, Territories and Roads Minister Jim Lloyd has pointed out that the Island is facing economic difficulties linked to a drop in tourism following changes to the market and two unfortunate high-profiles murders on the Island - Janelle Patton in 2002 and the 2004 murder of the Deputy Chief Minister Toon' Buffett.

Whatever the impetus for reform, whether it is economic, or a growing call for a system of government more in line with Australian models, it is a welcome development for all parties that the Norfolk Island Government has put forward suggestions about the proposed models. The two models under discussion are a reformed territory parliament, along the lines of the ACT or Northern Territory parliaments, or a Local Government model, along the lines of the model that operates in Christmas and Cocos Islands.

Indications are that the Norfolk Island Government is favouring territory status at this stage. The local government model offers advantages to the Island. It is a system which would complement the unique character of the Island and provide grass-roots representation with a clear focus on service delivery and the infrastructure needs of the community. It appears there is a growing need for aged care facilities on the Island which urgently need to be addressed.

The Norfolk Island Government in its further deliberations, should look no further than the strengths of Local Government and its record in responding to the aspirations, and needs of the people it represents. Though no model is perfect, this would be a good path for the government and the people of Norfolk Island to take.

National road deaths down in July

Figures released by the Australian Transport Safety Bureau (ATSB) showed that 111 people died in road crashes last month, 21 per cent down on the number of deaths in July 2005. The July result was one of the lowest monthly figures on record. During the first seven months of 2006, the total number of road deaths dropped by 1.4 per cent compared with the same period last year. This included a 7 per cent reduction in deaths of vehicle drivers. The Minister for Local Government, Territories and Roads, the Hon Jim Lloyd, said that despite these positive signs, the level of road trauma in this country remained unacceptably high and must be seriously addressed by all governments, the vehicle industry and the wider community. "I am particularly concerned about current trends among our most vulnerable road user groups. ATSB data show that pedestrian deaths have increased by 9 per cent during 2006 and bicyclist deaths are up by 13 per cent," Mr Lloyd said. Mr Lloyd said that road trauma was influenced by many factors and it was unclear if current economic circumstances, such as increased fuel prices, were having any impact on the number and distribution of road deaths. In the period January to July 2006, there were 917 deaths on the nation's roads, compared with 930 in the same period last year.

Glenorchy celebrates cultural diversity

Local buses will help Glenorchy acknowledge and celebrate the importance of its residents drawn from the four corners of the globe, with a new poster campaign. Local people and their values are behind the campaign to promote mutual understanding between different cultural groups within schools communities in Glenorchy, the Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Immigration and Multicultural Affairs, Andrew Robb, said. Funded by a Federal Government Living in Harmony grant, Glenorchy City Council has produced the Diversity: We are who we are campaign. The campaign, launched last week, will see posters on buses that featured striking images and quotes by school students and community members in Glenorchy.

The Australian Government supported Glenorchy Council in this work through a community grant of nearly \$24,000 through the *Living in Harmony* program. This is the seventh year of *Living in Harmony* grants which typically allocate \$5,000 to \$50,000 to local projects. Since 1998 there have been more than 304 grants under the program.

National Cultural Heritage Forum update

The National Cultural Heritage Forum (NCHF), met with the Minister Campbell and Department Secretary of Environment and Heritage in Canberra last week. The Forum was briefed on a range of key policy issues currently before Department of Environment and Heritage, including proposed amendments to the Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act , the future of the Register of the National Estate (RNE), and the latest progress in world heritage listing. ALGA, as a member of the Forum took the opportunity to express Local Government's concerns with the key finding and recommendations arising from the recently released Productivity Commission Report of Heritage Conservation. ALGA asked Minister Campbell to give close consideration to the many submissions that were forwarded to the Commission, and recognize that the Commonwealth was particularly well placed to provide a strong leadership role in protecting Australia's built heritage. Membership of the NCHF is appointed by the Minister and operates on a largely voluntary role. Participants include International Council on Monuments and Sites, Australian Heritage Council, Museums Australia, Australasian Institute of Maritime Archaeology, Australian Council of National Trusts, Property Council of Australia, Royal Australian Institute of Architects.

Wattle Day

The <u>Wattle Day Association</u> is interested in exploring opportunities with local councils to promote wattle as a national symbol of Australia. As the floral emblem of Australia, wattle has both official and community acceptance. The proposal is for citizenship ceremonies throughout Australia to be closely linked with the observance of Wattle Day and a sprig of wattle blossom presented to each new citizen.

Vale - the Hon Dr Reginald (Spot) Turnbull

The recent death of the Hon Dr Reginald (Spot) Turnbull, former Senator for Tasmania and former Mayor of Launceston was marked by Condolence Motions in the Senate on August 8. The Senate President described Dr Turnbull as 'one of the most significant political figures in Tasmanian politics in the second half of the 20th century. Dr Turnbull was an MHA for Bass from 1946 until 1961, when he resigned to successfully contest a Senate election becoming Australia's first Independent Senator. He was a gifted physician who contributed greatly to improvements in public health. Dr Turnbull served in the Tasmanian Parliament as Labor's Minister for Health for 11 years and subsequently as his state's Treasurer. In local government, his achievements in Tasmania included overseeing the introduction of fluoride to town water to improve dental health - a very worthy achievement - the introduction of compulsory X-rays to help fight tuberculosis, improvements to women's health services and encouraging the establishment of the Royal Flying Doctor Service in Tasmania. Dr Turnbull was a popular and effective mayor of Launceston while serving as a senator. He was once described as the 'stormy petrel' of politics. Following his 90th birthday, 'Spot' indulged in a series of living wakes because he said he would not spend money on parties he could not attend. He remained interested in politics throughout his long life and received a Centenary of Federation Medal for his parliamentary service.

Vale - the Hon Kevin Stewart

Bulldogs rugby league club president and former Local Government Minister the Hon Kevin Stewart has died of cancer at the age of 77, the club announced. Stewart, a former NSW parliamentarian and health minister in the Labor government of Neville Wran, died in Canterbury Hospital in the early hours on Tuesday. Mr Stewart was Local Government Minister from 10 February, 1984 to 31 December, 1985. He had been president of the club since 2002. Mr Stewart's funeral service will be held at St Mary's Cathedral in Sydney at 11am on Monday August 28.

Vocational Education Research report

The National Centre for Vocational Education Research (NCVER) report - Creating synergies: Local government facilitating learning and development through partnerships - documents the evolution of four learning communities in Victoria, which are involved in local government. It investigates the challenges and complexities involved in getting these communities off the ground and what roles, if any, vocational education and training (VET) institutions have played. Key principles emerging from the study include the importance of recognising different stakeholders' values and perspectives, appreciating multiple outcomes and proactively managing the relationships between various groups of stakeholders. Key findings include that local government has enormous potential and resources to contribute to the community and that VET is a necessary part of the system but has not been particularly proactive in the four cases described in this study. Yubari's population is now one tenth of what it was in the 1960s, and the government's decision to cut back spending on public works and to reduce the amount of central funding for the regions is making matters worse.

Roads Investment Revealed

Over half of the money spent on Western Australia's local road network in the last financial year was provided from Local Government own source revenue, according to a report released yesterday.

The 10th Local Government Road Assets and Expenditure Report by the Western Australian Local Government Association outlines the investment and current condition of WA's 121,000 kilometres of local road network.

Nearly \$400 million was spent on the network in the 2004/05 financial year with over 50% provided by Councils' own source revenue, 28% (\$110m) from the Federal Government, 20% (\$77m) from the State Government and 1.6% (\$6m) coming from private sources.

Association President, Cr Bill Mitchell said that the report highlighted the important role played by Local Government in maintaining local road networks but that more funding was needed to make up an ever increasing shortfall.

"Councils continue to recognise the importance of providing a safe and efficient local road network to allow for the community to use it for connecting to employment, education, social and leisure pursuits and have increased their investment by \$10m over the past year," Cr Mitchell said.

"Current investment is still \$86m short of what is needed to maintain the network in its current condition. This demonstrates a disturbing trend in that in 2001/02 this shortfall was \$50m and it has continued to increase each year since then.

"Councils are facing increasing pressure from industry and the community to not only maintain the network in its current condition but also enhance local roads to provide for greater safety, connectivity and accessibility, particularly by heavy vehicles.

Cr Mitchell said the Association would continue to advocate having the Federal and State Governments recognise local roads as vital for the economic and social benefits of the community.

"Further assistance from these spheres of Governments is needed to enable the community to have access to a safe, accessible and connected local road network."

Thank you for your letter regarding the above.

The City has several concerns with regard to water governance, most of which have been brought to the fore by the City's experience in pursuing the urban development of North Forrestdale. The City's concerns are addressed in response to each of the terms of reference of the Committee which are reproduced in italics below.

 a) responsibilities and accountability of public sector agencies, communities and the private sector in governance of water resources;

The City's experience in facilitating urban development in the North Forrestdale area has exposed concerns that water management responsibilities are unclear and highlighted that even where responsibilities are clear they are not being carried out. The following key concerns have arisen:

- (i) Arterial drainage planning has not been carried out in a timely fashion and has significantly affected the progress of urban development in the North Forrestdale area. At one stage after rezonings had taken place the Water Corporation declared, in hindsight probably not unreasonably, that it would not recommend support for any subdivisions in this area until arterial drainage planning was undertaken. Arterial drainage planning is the responsibility of the new Department of Water and its predecessors (e.g. the Department of Environment and the Water and Rivers Commission).
- (ii) Arterial drainage planning that has recently been carried out found that significant land areas in both the Cities of Armadale and Gosnells would be necessary to store 1:100 year average recurrence interval peak flows. For the Forrestdale Main Drain Catchment, if conservation category wetlands cannot be utilised for flood storage, 36ha comprising 22ha in three parcels and 14ha in drains widened to between 24 and 45m is needed across the Cities of Armadale and Gosnells.

Responsibility for purchase and then management of the 36ha of land is unclear.

The Water Corporation have noted that their licence, as issued by the Economic Regulation Authority, only requires that the Corporation manage peak flows up to five year average recurrence interval (see Clause 7.2 of the Water Corporation Operating Licence).

The City contends that the Water Corporation should have responsibility for 1:100 year average recurrence interval storms in urban areas, and that the purchase and management of areas to accommodate 1:100 year average recurrence interval peak flows that cannot be accommodated in standard road reserves should be funded from drainage rates.

To be left with the suggestion that the local government has a responsibility for peak flows when the Water Corporation has over many years collected drainage rates from the subject land appears to be incongruous.

- (iii) The City of Armadale commends the "Interim approach for integrating urban water management with land use planning within the Southern River area Guidance for Developers" prepared by the Southern River Steering Committee, and considers that the approach merits consideration for wider application across parts of the state where urban development is proposed for areas with a high water table.
- the legal and regulatory framework and its impact on effective water governance
 See (c) below.
- economic and environmental sustainability of the current approach to governance of water resources;
- (i) The split between arterial drainage managed by the Water Corporation and local drainage managed by local government is unclear and causes a number of difficulties and inequities.

The ad-hoc nature of the split leads to inequities in drainage costs borne by ratepayers in different local governments. For example, in the area covered by the North Forrestdale Stage 1 Structure Plan the City is taking on responsibility for the design and will probably end up managing a significant drainage channel that should probably be considered an arterial drain, leading to additional costs for this City's ratepayers. The City contends that drainage costs should be borne on a catchment basis and be funded through drainage rates.

The split results in no organisation having or taking responsibility for catchment management initiatives to improve water quality. In the North Forrestdale area the Environmental Protection Authority has not formally assessed proposed urban development on the basis of that state and local government agencies will work together to manage drainage water quality. An Urban Water Management Strategy prepared by the (then) Water and Rivers Commission for this area identified education as the principle strategy to manage drainage water quality, but responsibility for an effective education program has not been determined.

Unless there are clear responsibilities for catchment management with appropriate funding, catchment management initiatives such as education are unlikely to be developed or implemented.

(ii) Water conservation is a key objective in the Southern River/ Forrestdale/ Brookdale/ Wungong District Structure Plan area in which North Forrestdale lies. A key demand management measure to reduce the draw on potable water resources is the concept of a 'third pipe' system which uses 'community' bores to provide water for irrigation of private gardens and public open space. Inquiry into the Governance of Western Australia's Water Resources cont'd...

This approach potentially avoids the problems of excessive drawdown from private bore use adversely affecting wetlands. The approach has the support of major developers in the North Forrestdale area, probably in part because it enables water features (i.e. artificial lakes) to be incorporated into subdivisions. The artificial lakes are designed to achieve a complete turnover of water in the lake of six days or less based on the likely use of irrigation water during summer. A longer turnover period, which will be a result if a third pipe system is not implemented, is a recipe for smelly algal blooms and midge swarms during summer.

The environmental, water conservation benefits and economic benefits for land development industry of a third pipe system for this area are clear.

The licensed water service provider (i.e. the Water Corporation) for this area has not yet made a decision if it wants to operate a third pipe system, but subdivision is taking place that includes water features (i.e. artificial lakes) designed assuming that a third pipe system will be implemented. The profitability or otherwise of operating such a system is unknown, so the option of it being run by a non-government operator has not been investigated.

The City requests that the Committee give serious consideration to the governance and operation of third pipe systems.

d) demand for and equity of allocation of water resources;

See (c) (ii) above.

e) any other matter deemed relevant
