ASBESTOS DISPOSAL

From **1 July 2023**, the Armadale Landfill and Recycling Facility will no longer accept commercial loads of asbestos.

City of Armadale residents will still be permitted to dispose of up to 5kg of asbestos containing materials, Monday to Saturday between 8.30am and 12.30pm.

Asbestos loads must be correctly wrapped and labelled. For further information visit armadale.wa.gov.au/asbestos-disposal

Larger loads of asbestos can be disposed of at the following facilities*:

1. **Henderson Waste Recovery Park**
2. **Millar Road Landfill (Rockingham)**
3. **Ranford Road Resource Recovery & Waste Transfer Station**
4. **Red Hill Waste Management Facility**
