

Native Plants for Residents FAQ

The Free Native Plants initiative of the City of Armadale offers an array of plants to help the community create a greener and more sustainable Armadale. The native plants provided will help expand our urban forest and provide habitat for wildlife.

How do I register

You must sign up using Humantix. The registration period will remain open until all tickets have been distributed. There are only 800 tickets available, distributed across 3 sessions.

If you are experiencing difficulties accessing Humantix, email us, and we will register you instead.

Residents will need to provide proof of their address.

There will only be 10 plants offered per residential address not per person living at the same address.

What if I didn't register can I still turn up and get plants?

This is a ticketed event. There is no waiting list for plants, and if you show up at the event without a ticket, we will ask you to return after the event is over to check if there is any plants left over.

What if I can't attend on that day can I still register for plants?

You will still need register for plants via Humantix however you will need to contact one of our environment officers to confirm proof of ID and details of the person collecting on your behalf. Plants will still need to be collected on the day.



Will a plant list be available?

A list will be available on our website for people to see what plants are on offer. Staff will also be on hand to give advice on the plant species, planting information.

Is the venue wheel chair accessible and is their Acrod parking available?

This is a wheel chair friendly event. However you will need to obtain a parking permit before the day.

Can I order multiple tickets for each member of my household?

Each residential address may choose up to 10 plants. There is a limit of two (2) plants of the same species with every order of 10 plants. Only one ticket per household. Just one time slot is available for ordering and attendance per residential address
