The City recently released the Community Health and Wellbeing Plan 2021-2024 (CHWP), which provides a framework to contribute to improving health and wellbeing outcomes for residents to enable people to live well and experience the best possible quality of life.

The CHWP identifies strategies and actions to prevent and minimise public health risks as well as improve community health and wellbeing.

The development of the CHWP involved an extensive consultation process with over 1,000 people, 147 staff and 19 stakeholder organisations involved.

Armadale Mayor Ruth Butterfield said "By working together in tandem with our community, I'm confident we can create a healthy future for all who reside or work within the City of Armadale."

New pump track

FOR FLEMATTI PARK

If you're a fan of pump tracks then the new facility at Flematti Park, located in Brookdale, is going to hit the mark!

Stage One of the local recreational facility delivers a small but very cool clay formed pump track providing a variety of conditions for all bikes.

The pump track is surrounded by an undulating path perfect for little kids to practice riding their bike or scooter on and recently completed landscape works will provide much needed shade over the path networks once the trees establish and grow over the next few years.



Supporting amenities include a picnic shelter, seating and rubbish bin. Additional tree planting, pedestrian, and a central turfed area suitable for year-round use will be completed in Stage Two of the project.

Stage One of the Flematti Park pump track cost approximately \$250,000.

Twenty-one students from across the City graduated from the **2021 Armadale Aspire Youth Career Development Program**. Now in its fourth year, the initiative increases the job-readiness of local students, broadens their horizons, and introduces them to diverse employment opportunities within our region. In a nutshell, the program is all about connecting students with employment.

lastair Kleyn, owner and director of Alita Constructions based in the Forrestdale Business Park, is passionate about engaging with the Armadale community and its youth, and believes the City's Aspire program gives local students a sense of the business world. "The Aspire program shows students that they can live and work here and be an active member of the local community. Armadale can offer students a very good future," Alastair said.

"Over the last couple of years, it's been great to be involved with the Aspire program. Our teens are our future workforce, and as a local business, we have an obligation to show them the variety of employment opportunities available.

"Students visited one of our local construction sites at the Forrestdale Business Park. They donned high vis vests and were given a tour of the site to give them a real-world view of the industry.

"If students wanted to get a head start on a career in construction, they could get their white card online, and seek out a work experience placement. They could also contact the Construction Training Fund for more information about school-based training, including scholarships for Certificate II in Years 11 and 12," Alastair said.

"Throughout Aspire, we gave students insights into the career opportunities available in a commercial construction company, and key staff shared their job requirements, experience, and insights."



This year's Aspire program featured partnerships between six major high schools and eight industry partners including Beaver Tree Services, Armadale Fitness and Aquatic Centre, Alita Constructions, Crossroads Mechanical, WA Police Force, Bean Thru, Curtin University and the Small Business Development Corporation.

Keeping fit IN THE GREAT OUTDOORS!

Have you seen the new workout signage located at 16 parks and reserves across the City?

The workouts were developed by the City's accredited fitness instructors as part of the Move Your Body Fitness Session - Pilot program. These fitness sessions were for those 60+ years and ran over three months earlier this year.

The workout signage installation and fitness sessions were made possible through a successful grant application from the Injury Matters WA 'Stay on Your Feet' program and focused on improving participants' strength and balance and raising awareness of falls and injury prevention.

The signage and outdoor exercise equipment transformed green spaces into free mini-gyms with beginner, intermediate and advanced workouts, including a warm up and cool down for everyone to enjoy.

The Noongar season of Kambarang was celebrated during the Kambarang Festival at the City of Armadale's Bob Blackburn Reserve in Seville Grove on Tuesday 12 October.

The festival opened with a traditional welcome to country and smoking ceremony and was emceed by Samuel-Yombich Pilot-Kickett. Live entertainment was provided by musicians Rubi Joelle, Gina Williams & Guy Ghouse, and The Struggling Kings. Activities for the whole family included elders' and children's hubs, information stalls with giveaways, and a free sausage sizzle.

It was encouraging to see the growing number of people who attended the event, as it helps to broaden people's understanding of Aboriginal culture and their relationship with the land.

Kambarang is the season of birth and takes place during the months of October and November as the weather becomes warmer.

The 2021 Wooroloo bushfire was a reminder to everyone living in a bushfire area that there's always the possible threat of a bushfire near you this summer. Last fire season reported 64 incidents in the Armadale region.

Remember these four simple steps - Create your bushfire plan, prepare your property, pack an emergency kit and make sure you understand the Bushfire Warnings System.

Bushfire Plan

- Develop a bushfire plan that outlines what you will do
 if a bushfire occurs. You can visit mybushfireplan.
 wa.gov.au or download the My Bushfire Plan app
 from the App Store or Google Play.
- During a bushfire it can be difficult to think clearly.

 Planning ahead will help keep you and your family safe.
- "We will wait and see" is not a bushfire plan. "We never thought it could reach us here" is not a bushfire plan.
- If your plan is to leave, make sure you leave early.
 Only stay if you are physically and mentally prepared to defend your property and you have all the right equipment.
- Remember to plan for your pets and/or livestock during a bushfire they will need water, shelter and a safe place to stay.
- Practice your plan regularly with your family, write it down and make sure everyone knows where it is.

Changes to Bushfire Warnings

Western Australia has joined with other Australian states and territories to deliver nationally consistent emergency information through the Australian Warning System (AWS).

This means that you'll see new Bushfire Warning colours and icons on Emergency WA. Ensure you know the new Bushfire Warning system and what each alert level means.



ADVICE

A fire has started but there is no immediate threat to lives or homes. **Be aware and keep up to date.**



WATCH AND ACT

There is a possible threat to lives or homes. You need to leave or get ready to defend – do not wait and see.



EMERGENCY WARNING

There is a threat to lives or homes.

You are in danger and need to take immediate action to survive.



CARING FOR YOUR STREET TREE

As part of the City's Urban
Forest Strategy, the parks teams
have been busy planting street
trees (during the cooler months)
to give them the best chance
to establish before the onset of
summer.

Street trees are a significant component of the City's urban forest and provide an important role in the community - to ensure leafy neighbourhoods now and in the future.

To give the new street trees the best possible start, the City will water and maintain them for at least two years after planting.

You can also help us care for the trees on your verge, both new and mature, to give them the best chance of a healthy life. Residents are encouraged to provide ongoing care by watering, mulching, improving the soil and removing weeds from around the base of the tree. This added care makes a significant difference to the tree's growth rate.

Enjoy caring for your new tree and watching it grow for years to come.


