Welcome to 2023 and the current Noongar season, Bunuru, well known for being the hottest part of the year.

It's been a busy start to 2023 with our popular community event Australia Day in Armadale a huge success. On the same day we welcomed 133 new citizens to the Armadale family and acknowledged several hard working local residents for their outstanding contributions with 2023 Australia Day Community Citizen of the Year awards.

In the coming months we will start 'preworks' along Eighth Road, in preparation for the major upgrade scheduled for construction in 2024/2025. The pre-works program will include preparing all the infrastructure associated with the road space and functionality, this includes relocating street lighting, gas lines, NBN network cabling, power poles, sewerage, storm water drainage and other related services. As a part of the bigger road upgrade project, Eighth Road will be developed into a leafy, median-strip divided thoroughfare. The upgrade will significantly improve safety, convenience and the amenity of the area. If you live nearby, you'll soon be hearing from the City with more information.

Over the next few weeks, the City will welcome two major sporting events – the Australian Rowing Championships (27 March – 2 April) and the Dams Challenge (16 April). You're invited to come down to the Champion Lakes Regatta Centre and watch the largest event in Australia's rowing calendar or pick a spot to watch the onroad cycling event, taking place across our beautiful City. Sponsorship of major events is part of the City's Strategic Community Plan, and is guided by our Tourism and Economic Development Strategies to attract events that contribute to the region's community and economy.

Skating and scooter enthusiasts will be interested to hear that Gwynne Park Skate Park is about to get a new artwork. During the April school holidays the temporary art decal will be replaced with a vibrant new mural. Over the recent summer school holidays, the concept was created by youth from the area, who attended codesign sessions and will work alongside a professional artist to create the mural.

In other news, I'd like to inform the community that the City of Armadale will be moving to a system whereby electors vote directly for the position of Mayor. This comes amid some of the largest changes to the Local Government Act in more than 25 years, where all Band 1 and 2 WA Local

Governments will be required to switch from the current method of Councillor's electing the Mayor. Armadale is a Band 1 Council so you will be able to participate in choosing the Mayor at the 21 October 2023 election.

The Mayor performs an important role within Council and has duties such as presiding at meetings, providing leadership and guidance to the community, performing civic and ceremonial duties, speaking on behalf of the City and working with the CEO to deliver on the City's vision via the Strategic Community Plan.

As well as being a full time job, being the Mayor of the City of Armadale is an honour and a privilege.



Exciting hews: CONSTRUCTION OF PIARA WATERS LIBRARY COMMENCING SOON!

Libraries are so much more than a home for books, they offer quiet areas for studying, common areas for collaboration, electronic resources and the internet along with a ranges of children and adult workshops and activities.

Residents located in the City of Armadale's western suburbs of Piara Waters and Harrisdale will soon have their own library to enjoy.

The design for the building was undertaken by Hunt Architects, renowned for consistently delivering functional, award-winning and innovated designs.

The Piara Waters Library will be located on the same site as the Piara Waters Pavilion and will provide a community hub with a cohesive connection to the existing sports facility.

The facility will feature an area of 1000m² of floor space and will comprise of meetings rooms, a youth space and children's area, accessible public computers and collaborative and private study spaces for patrons to enjoy.

As we go to print the City is assessing contractor submissions to undertake construction of the new facility. Construction is expected to start midyear with the project estimated to take 15 months for completion.

The State Government of Western Australia provided \$1 million for the project, with the remaining balance funded by the City of Armadale.



The City recently awarded the design contract to Donovan Payne Architects, who undertook the design of the award winning Armadale Fitness and Aquatic Centre.

Keep an eye on the City's website for information on consultation with key stakeholders which will take place during 2023.






Check out the latest park upgrade and take a look at Corondale Park in Seville Grove – a pirate ship has landed there!

Additional improvements to the revamped playground includes nature log play, multi goals and swing sets with a shaded picnic area. Take time to explore the reserve via the newly constructed walkways with two bridges providing access to each side of the reserve.

At the end of Granada Loop our parks team has installed brand new fitness equipment with workout signage to save you the hassle of trying to figure it out yourself!

The final stage to Ticklie Park upgrade includes new tiled soft fall in the playground and additional pathways, along with outdoor fitness equipment providing options for beginner, intermediate and advanced fitness levels.

THE DAMS CHALLENGE

The Dams Challenge is recognised as one of the 50 top rides in the world and is Western Australia's premier on-road cycling challenge organised by Westcycle, the peak body for bike riding in WA.

This year's event will attract more than 1,500 participants in addition to over 500 spectators from across WA and interstate.

The rides extend over 200km across Armadale and the Perth Hills region offering three different courses for all levels of riders, a 54km course (2 Dams), a 135km course (3 Dams) and a 205km course (5 Dams).

AUSTRALIAN ROWING CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Australian Rowing Championships will be hosted at the world class rowing facility Champion Lakes Regatta Centre, located in Armadale. This is the largest event of the rowing calendar in the country.

This week-long event, organised by Rowing Australia, comprises the following domestic competitions and events which include rowers between 11 to 40 years old, both male, female and para-rowers:

- Australian Open Rowing Championships (Mon-Sat)
- Australian Open Schools Championships (Thurs-Sun)
- King's and Queen's Cups Interstate Regatta (Sun)

Over seven days more than 1,700 competitors from around the country, along with coaches and support staff, volunteers, media and spectators will attend the premium event.

Celebrate Djeran WITH FREE NATIVE PLANTS

SUNDAY 7 MAY, 8AM - 12 NOON

Champion Centre, 76 Champion Drive, Seville Grove

The mild days and cool nights of Djeran season are a reprieve from the hot weather and the perfect time to establish a natural habitat in your own yard, verge, or porch.

Come along and speak with the City's environment team and learn how to care and connect with your native garden and find out what function the plants will have in your garden. There's over 8,000 free tube stock seedlings available for City of Armadale residents, in a variety of species!

Our local plant species cope with the challenging WA climate, they require less water and fertiliser and provide food and shelter for insects, birds, reptiles and small mammals.

- 10 native plants per household (limit of two (2) plants of the same species)

Remember to bring a box, bag or container to carry your seedlings home and a keep-cup to purchase a warm drink if you wish.

CREATING WILDLIFE HABITATS

The City's private land conservation program Habitat Links helps to conserve natural areas and promotes the importance of ecological corridors and habitat for wildlife to the wider community.

Landowners with properties within Special Residential, Rural Living, or Rural zones adjacent to priority conservation value bushland, wetlands or watercourse are eligible to register for the program.

As part of the program, Bedfordale resident Mark Osborne, along with other eligible residents received free native seedlings and the support of a dedicated Environmental Officer to assist in enhancing the biodiversity and health of the City's treasured natural environment.

"Moving to the area directly from the United Kingdom 18 years ago we were fortunate to find a lovely place to live in Bedfordale," said Mark.

"The block had some basic landscaping but we wanted to encourage wildlife and especially birds but knew nothing about native plants and how to go about the change".

"Research led us to Habitat Links and Sandra and the team helped us 'populate' the winter stream and surrounding areas with countless plants and lots of advice".

"What was once a fairly barren block has flourished. Tiny tube stock has become 15m trees providing shade for a huge range of other local native plants".

Participants of the program received technical advice of native plant species selection, planting techniques to maximise survival, weed management, feral animal management, creating wildlife habitat and erosion management.

"If we'd not had the help of Habitat Links we'd have chosen the wrong plants and no doubt lost many of them due to the summer conditions. Instead it's now a haven for birdlife and a wildlife corridor between the two sides of our valley".

"Huge thanks to the City and their Habitat Links team," said Mark Osborne.

INCREASING OUR BIODIVERSITY -WESTFIELD HERON WETLAND

Next time you're out and about looking for a picnic spot check out the Westfield Heron Wetland, located in Camillo.


What was once considered a water corporation ugly duckling has been transformed into a lively community hub with connecting walkways across the reserve if you're feeling like a leisurely stroll!

The installation of a feature deck overlooking the wetland features three distinct arches etched with artwork showcasing the local fauna and vegetation of the region.

Visitors to the wetlands can enjoy a BBQ area complete with shelters and picnic furniture, and a turfed area irrigated by a recently installed bore. The newly planted trees surrounding the area will provide much needed shade in years to come and contribute to the City's Urban Forest canopy.

Additional native species planted around the wetland will assist with native wildlife breeding places to increase the natural habitat in the area.

The transformation of the wetland project was made possible through a Local Roads and Community Infrastructure (LRCI) grant of \$1.5 million.

COMMUNITY GRANTS 2022/23

ROUND 2 - NOW OPEN

Did you know the City provides two rounds of community grants up to \$5,000 each financial year, with the aim of supporting community-based initiative development by groups located in the district?

In round one of the City's 2022/23 Community Grants the Armadale Triathlon Club, pictured above, received \$2,500 towards hosting the first triathlon event held at the Champion Lakes Regatta Centre.

Armadale Triathlon Committee Treasurer Zara Fear said, "We were lucky enough to receive the City of Armadale Community Grant to help with the costs associated with hosting our first triathlon event. We have seen a huge interest from the community in our events, with participation numbers increasing to about 119 participants for our triathlon just gone.

"One of the things we pride ourselves in, is keeping our entry costs quite low to make our events accessible to more people within the community. Without the City of Armadale Community Grant, we would have had to increase the entry fee to help us cover these extra costs which may have meant some people wouldn't have been able to afford to participate.

"We were also honoured that City of Armadale Mayor, Ruth Butterfield, attended our kids race to give a warm welcome and to kick off the start of our event," said Zara Fear.

Light tanker JOINS THE FLEET!

The Bedfordale Volunteer Bush Fire Brigade recently took delivery of a new Light Tanker, designed to provide firefighting capability in areas of open pasture, grazing, bush and urban environments – making it a perfect fit for the Bedfordale area.

Mayor Ruth Butterfield said she was delighted to attend the handover of the Light Tanker, as like most residents living in the hills and foothills, bush fire preparedness and safety sits very close to her heart.

"Memories of bush fire do not fade quickly. Those who endured the Kelmscott fires in 2011 will attest to that.

"The trade for living within such a beautiful landscape is the requirement to be forever aware of the risk of bush fire and I wish to acknowledge and thank the State Government and DFES for providing the new Light Tanker for the Bedfordale Volunteer Bus Fire Brigade to better protect our community," said Mayor Butterfield.

The tanker can withstand the harshest conditions, yet still provide firefighters the ability to transverse difficult terrains, and operate in tight spaces where larger 4x4 appliances cannot reach.

It's equipped with the latest crew protection capabilities, crew welfare, and ergonomic stowage solutions whilst still maintaining its simplistic operational approach for users.

Holding 500 litres of water, the Light Tanker will be an important resource in both rural and built environments and having it available to our community makes us all feel just that little bit safer.



GROWING OUR COMMUNITY SURVEY

Our City is made up of 19 suburbs with over 100,000 residents, so we regularly ask for feedback to help inform our programs and service delivery.

Australia Day in Armadale saw a total of 133 residents from 30 countries, some from as far away as Iran and Brazil, receive their Australian citizenship.

Australian Citizenship for Ramin Yazdan-latif was a journey that began in Iran before moving to New Zealand with his family 15 years ago.

A great job offer in Perth as a commercial helicopter pilot saw him travel across the Tasman to settle in Perth, Western Australia.

Ramin said, "After meeting my wife, Marie Cris Villahermosa in the Philippines we applied for residency under the skilled migration status.

"Following a weekend drive through Armadale's western suburbs, we fell in love with the residential areas in Piara Waters and made the decision to settle there. "I'm so glad the Armadale Council preserved the nature around this region which makes it a beautiful and peaceful place to live.

"I will guarantee that this is the place that I and my wife will stay for a long period of time as we get older... a place that you will feel safe and sound for the rest of your life," said Ramin.

KIDSPORT FUNDING \$\$\$\$

Did you know that the KidSport Program provides up to \$150 per calendar year towards club fees for eligible children from 5 to 18 years?

KidSport is run by the Department of Local Government Sport and Cultural Industries, with the help of local governments.

For Coralie McCormack the popular KidSport program has allowed her children to participate in the Swim School classes run at Armadale Fitness and Aquatic Centre.

"I have four children and being able to use the vouchers for swimming lessons has been very beneficial – without them I wouldn't have been able to commit to ongoing lessons for them all," said Coralie.
