

MAYOR'S Message

Welcome to Bunuru, the current Noongar season, and to the first edition of City Views for 2024.

We've certainly hit the ground running with a very busy start to the year. Our popular community event, Australia Day in Armadale, was enjoyed by almost 26,000 people and featured live music from a top line up of local and Perth acts, culminating in fireworks. On the same day, we welcomed 129 new citizens from 29 countries, and were able to acknowledge several hard-working local residents for their outstanding contributions to our community, as part of our Community Citizen of the Year Awards. It was also my pleasure to present Mr Jeff Munn with Honorary Freeman of the Municipality after Council endorsed his nomination late last year. Jeff's impact within the community, over many years, has been substantial. More information about our Citizen Awards and Jeff's contributions are on page 10.

Music in the Park is in full swing, with a number of established musicians, local emerging artists, schools and community groups set to share their performances in Memorial Park every Saturday. In May, we welcome the return of the Armadale Arts Festival and Minnawarra Art Awards. Plus, after last year's success, our Let's Connect Expo will be back, showcasing a variety of support services available throughout the City. We'll even see the return of the National Dragon Boat AusChamps to Champion Lakes, for the first time in almost 10 years. Needless to say, there's plenty going on for everyone in our City.

In May, our annual Native Plants for Residents giveaway will see us continue to encourage and support residents in building and growing natural habitats and wild gardens around their homes. We've also got 142 trees on order for planting during this year's Street Tree Request Program -

I'm pleased to announce the City has successfully secured a \$25,000 grant from the latest WA Hiking Participant funding round offered by the Department of Local Government, Sport and Cultural Industries. We'll also welcome the 2024 Trails Forum to our City this April, with a focus on Aboriginal engagement, governance, trail tourism, and sustainable trail development. More information is available on the DLGSCI website and registrations will open soon. Sponsorship of major events is part of the City's Strategic Community Plan and continues to be guided by our Tourism and Economic Development Strategies to attract events that contribute to the region's community and economy.

Green waste collections are back from April, and we have a useful online tool available to help you check the date it's coming to your area. Unfortunately, the unlawful dumping of mattresses is an ongoing problem in our community, even though free mattress collections can be booked at any time of the year. LONDON PLANE TREE RELOCATION

Recently, the City collaborated on successfully transplanting and relocating four mature London Plane Trees 'platanus acerifolius' from the City's CBD area to their new home in Rotary Park, Armadale.

After hearing the four trees, estimated to be up to 20 years old, were earmarked for removal as part of METRONET's Byford Rail Extension project, it was decided the trees were far too valuable to end up as mulch. The decision was made to transplant them and relocate them to Rotary Park, where they will provide shade for years to come.

JULL STREET MALL Improvement Project

Change is here!

Exciting times are here for Armadale's CBD. The upgrade of the mall is just one of a number of projects working towards the development of a vibrant and active link through the heart of the City Centre.

This space will be critical in connecting the Shopping Precinct and adjacent businesses with the new Armadale Train Station and elevated viaduct (a METRONET project that began in late-2023), the new Armadale TAFE Campus (under construction and due to be completed in 2025), and the recently opened \$89M Courthouse & Police Complex.

So, what improvements can you expect to see as part of these Juli Street Mall enhancements?

- Lipgraded street furniture throughout the mall, with new seating options and
- Improved safety with enhanced lighting
- Replacement of existing light poles with suspended catenary lighting and
- factoring the mall with the introduction of beautiful, soft landscape areas
- Paving remediation works.

TROON PARK PLAYGROUND REPLACEMENT

The playground at Troon Park is due for replacement and we're grateful to the local community for playing a part in the adventure.

Stage one of the consultation ran for two weeks and involved nearby residents and users of Troon Park partaking in a survey focused on ideal playground improvements.

From the results, we found park-users wanted to see the current playground modernised with a variety of play experiences – especially swinging and sliding! Following the need to update the current playground, improving access and providing additional park amenities was commonly requested.



All feedback received from the surveys were then collated and used to help form the basis of the proposed concept plan.

Works to replace the existing playground are set to commence this month, with expected completion in May 2024.




Blackspot **PROJECTS**

The City is honoured to announce the title of Honorary Freeman of the Municipality has been awarded to Mr Jeffrey Harold Munn CMC.

Jeff served the community as a Councillor for 36 years, which included 14 years as Deputy Mayor of the City. His local government service began in 1975 and, during his time, he served as a committee member of many council and state committees.

Jeff has been a civil marriage celebrant since 1983, and has presided over 3400 weddings, funerals, and naming ceremonies. He was a Justice of the Peace for 24 years.

Jeff was the Founding President of the Armadale Table Tennis Club, the Vice President of the Roleystone Bowling Club, and a soccer referee for amateur matches for many years, which saw him included as a life member of the Amateur Referee Association (Football West). Jeff's love of community sport contributed to him advocating for improved sporting facilities across the City.

Mayor Ruth Butterfield said: "It was a pleasure to recognise Jeff Munn's contributions, with the title of 'Honorary Freeman of the Municipality'. Jeff's dedication to public service and to the City made him a role model and mentor for many new Councillors."

STREET TREE request program

Our Street Tree Request Program for residents is growing! Winter 2023 saw 78 trees planted and we've got 142 trees on order for planting in 2024.

> Thank you to all our residents for participating and helping us grow the Armadale urban forest.

The summer heat is well and truly upon us, and it's super important to give your verge tree some additional TLC—trees feel heat stress just like us! Providing your tree with an extra drink in the hotter months has a significant impact on their establishment and growth rate.

How much water?

Newly planted trees require more frequent watering than established trees. It takes approximately three vears for trees to fully establish.

Ideally your new trees should be given 50 litres at each watering. The following watering intervals will give your tree the best chance of establishing properly:

1-2 weeks after planting, water daily

3-12 weeks after planting, water every 2-3 days

After 12 weeks, water weekly until roots are established (approximately three years)



Swap - Don't Shop

Following the success of November Swap – Don't Shop event, which saw 65kg of clothing diverted from landfill, the City of Armadale continued its commitment to promoting circular economy by hosting a Children's Storytime in February.



Over 110kg of items were donated, with 55kg being swapped and the remainder donated to St Vinnies and the Drop 'n' Shop Reuse Centre. That's 100% of donation materials diverted from landfill!

The Children's Storytime event sought to change the community's relationship with products and encourage sharing and reusing instead of always buying new. This has

both financial and environmental implications, with the event aiming to focus on perspective change on extending the life of products and materials and reducing the need to always buy something new.

The emphasis on sharing and reusing toys, games and books allowed families to leave the event with 'new' treasures, whilst contributing to a significant reduction in their environmental footprint.





Green waste verge collections

Green waste collections are starting in April. To check your collection zone use the address look up tool at

armadale.wa.gov.au/my-waste-collection-day

WHAT WILL BE COLLECTED

Tree and shrub prunings up to:

- / 1.5 metres in length
- ✓ 150mm (6 inches) in diameter
- ✓ 6 cubic metres
- (approx. 3 trailer loads).

Green waste can be placed on the verge up to 2 weeks prior to the collection start date.

WHAT WILL NOT BE COLLECTED

- Boxes or bags of leaves or grass clippings
- Dug out lawn, sand or soil.
- X Long branches (over 1.5m)
- Garden chemicals, garden pots or reticulation
- General waste
- X Sawn and treated timber
- Green waste placed near services, reticulation, walls or structures
- Green waste on vacant land or public reserves.





BUSHFIRE SEASON REMINDER

FIREBREAKS

All properties over 5,000m² must have a firebreak installed on or before **30 November 2023** and maintained until **31 March 2024**.

TOTAL FIRE BAN

During a total fire ban you must not light a fire in the open air or use any equipment in the open air that is likely to emit sparks.

This includes the use of wood fuel BBQs, pizza ovens, chimeneas and incinerators; angle grinders, welders & chainsaws; lawn mowers or brush cutters; candles.

DATES TO REMEMBER BURNING PROHIBITED

1 December 2023 - 31 March 2024

RESTRICTED BURNING PERIOD (permits required)

1 October 2023 - 30 November 2023 and 1 April 2024 - 31 May 2024

No burning on Sundays or Public Holidays.
