The origin of the Scottish name is thought to mean the "arm of the hills", and both Armadale village and castle on Skye, and Armadale village in Sutherland have hills that jut out into the sea. (ref: 2723-1961 page 245)In 1836 surveyor Alfred Hillman led a party to survey a route linking Perth with Albany. After leaving Kelmscott (which was established in 1829), he followed the Neerigen Brook, eventually struggling up the wooded foothills of the escarpment before heading south. It was at this point which became a junction with another bush track, which was to become the South West Highway, that ARMADALE was established. The place was originally called Narrogin after the nearby Neerigen Brook and the "Ye Olde Narrogin Inne", built at the junctions of the Albany and Bunbury Roads in 1856 by Thomas Saw. When it was decided to gazette a townsite here in 1909, Narrogin was not acceptable because of possible confusion with the existing townsite of this name.
